Regular intensive enforcement drives against drunken driving are being conducted in coordination with the Traffic Police, Excise Department, and other stakeholders in the interest of public safety. In addition, regular road safety awareness programmes are being organized in schools, colleges, public places, and among transport operators. 3.Under Enforcement Duties, a total of 19,495 Motor Vehicle (MV) cases were registered during the financial year 2025-26, and fines amounting to ₹2,52,50,000 were realized.
